Montgomery County Ohio Horseman's Council is proud to work in partnership with both the State Park system and the Metro Park system to create, improve, and maintain the trails that we all love to ride. We actively support Sycamore State Park, Possum Creek Metro Park, and Twin Creek Metro Park. Colored maps of bridle trails in these three parks can be found on our website,

### **SYCAMORE STATE PARK**

A series of interconnecting trails totaling 18.9 miles, with the ability to add or subtract mileage to fit any riding style! The park is comprised of recovered farmland and wooded areas, located just outside of Trotwood on Wolf Creek Pike. There are water crossings at several places on the trails that allow horses to drink, and a nice combination of woods, grassland prairie and open areas to ride through. The grassy trail head is flat, shady and spacious with water hydrants, tie posts, a mounting platform and fire ring. The adjoining primitive camping area boasts 15 level campsites, with water, a security light, and a well maintained port-o-let facility.



### **TWIN CREEK METRO PARK**

Eleven miles of bridle trails crisscross Twin Creek just south of Germantown, allowing horse and rider to enjoy cool wooded paths, open grassland and refreshing water crossings. There is a gravel parking lot for trailers on Morning Star Rd., with horse ties, picnic tables, a grill and port-o-potty. No horse camping.



### **POSSUM CREEK METRO PARK**

Although the perimeter trail at Possum Creek is just 5 miles long (there is an inner loop), it provides quite a variety of terrain! Hardwood forests to open prairie, meandering creek to working farm, the view is constantly changing! A gravel parking lot on Frytown Rd. with water hydrant and port-a-potty and an adjacent picnic area with grill and tables. No horse camping.
